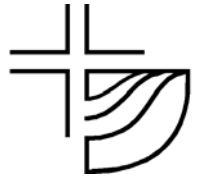

2009 Not So Boring Statistics

Not too long ago we were working on the 2009 Church of the Brethren Statistical Form, records we send to the office in Elgin indicating things like Membership, Attendance, and Giving. I was really amazed at the numbers. According to our records, we minister to over 300 people a week, when you combine Sunday morning worship along with the other various ministries that take place throughout the rest of the week. Looking back, that number has slowly increased over the past four years. More and more people are participating in some sort of ministry here at the Bunkertown church, giving us an opportunity to teach, serve, or care almost every day of the week (there are programs available Sunday through Thursday).

The number of people we reach becomes even greater when you take a look at our budgeted outreach. Think about all the various ministries we support outside of our congregation. According to our budget, we have pledged \$60,000 toward various outreach projects, plus other giving planned for ministries like the Children's Aid Society, Word of Life missions, or Central Pennsylvania Youth Ministries, to name a few. And the reality is that through our giving to these organizations, people are able to minister to those in need, care for the suffering, and witness in the name of Christ. Truthfully, the amount of people impacted for God through this church is far more than we could imagine.

How does that information make you feel? Me, I'm overwhelmed. It's as if God has taken what we do and magnified it for His glory and honor. But see, this is where it gets challenging. If we do want to maintain our current level of ministry, both here and abroad, our giving will have to increase. Based upon our current level of giving, we may have to cut back either some of our ministries within the church, or reduce the amount we give to ministries outside of the church. Our best guess is that this will happen either later this year or early next year.

I wanted you to know this so that you can make a choice today to continue forward, or a choice tomorrow to take a step backwards. Both of those choices are difficult, I realize that. But please know that what you do and how you give to this church IS making a difference in this world.

The Commissions Reports were given as follows:

1. Nurture Commission Report by Abe Fisher

Financial Peace-hosting a Financial Simulcast Live from Dallas Texas-Take Control of your money -a conference that would be for Financial Peace attendees/community /church/Well Spring recipients. On March 13th -a six hour conference will be held in the sanctuary via internet. Details to be worked out by the Nurture Commission.

The Commissions Reports were given as follows, continued:

2. Stewards Commission Report by Orlyn Saner

-Problem with ants-a licensed Orkin representative from Mifflintown visited the church & made us a proposal. Problem-will be continuous, three kinds of ants-will also treat for bees, mice and spiders. Proposal is \$175 initial treatment with a monthly cost of \$65. Price is solid for three years before needing to evaluate.

-Orlyn said the Stewards decided to sign up with Dominion for Electrical Power to get the discount since PP&L rates were increased

-Dumpster-\$39/week now, and \$48/wk for next size dumpster but would only be emptied every other week. Not going to change.

-Sound Board in FLC was cleaned and needs sold, & it's 7 yrs. old. We can get \$800 for it, possibly, & the speakers are blown in the FLC for the second time. Estimate for speakers and sound board is \$2,164.98.

3. Witness Commission Report by Linda Leonard

-We are starting revival and have designated the offering go to the Juniata/Mifflin County fuel assistance.

-We also need one person on the Jail Ministry to go with Michael Yakamook. Rod Knouse is in the process of being approved for this position.

Dear Bunkertown Church of the Brethren,

I am so excited to tell you about the amazing opportunity some of our youth will have this July 2010. One of our upcoming events is taking a trip to Peru. Giving our youth the opportunity to serve others and learn to share the Gospel message of Jesus Christ with other people. This experience will not only advance the kingdom of God, but train our youth to actively share their faith with their friends and others. From July 3rd 2010- July 12th 2010, Shellie Dimm, Amber Knouse, Andrea Jones, Emily Kauffman, Caleb & Andrea Beech, as well as six others from Richfield Mennonite Church will be embarking on this journey to Peru. The Lord has given each of them the opportunity to use their talents and participate in a missionary outreach with Word of Life's new TRL program to Peru. They are working alongside the Bunkertown Church of the Brethren's Youth (as well as Richfield Mennonite) to help us make this trip possible. TRL stands for "Teams Reaching the Lost", and it is designed to help youth groups and Christian schools Group Up and Go Out to reach people for the glory of God! After a period of on-sight training (called Boot Camp), we will fly to Peru where we will share the Word of God in open-air evangelism, churches, schools, children's meetings, youth rallies, vacation Bible schools, five-day clubs etc. It will be a very practical training experience for the youth as well as a wonderful opportunity to serve the Lord. Along with this wonderful opportunity comes the responsibility of raising both prayer and financial support. I would like for you to take a few moments right now and pray and ask God how you can be a part of this opportunity the Lord has given to our

youth. If the Lord leads you to help support them financially, please know that your money will be used to help reach those in Peru. If you would uphold them in prayer, it would greatly be appreciated. Pray that the hearts of the Peruvians would be prepared, that there will be safe travels, and that we raise all of our support.
